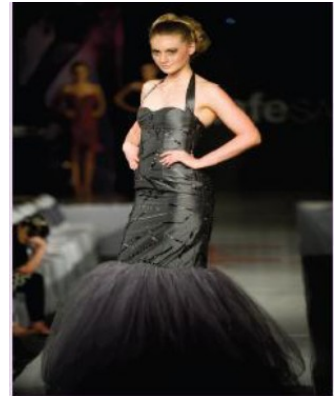

## 2012 Vocational Education and Training (VET) Programs

Now is the time to register your interest for a VET Program.

VET Programs are open to all students who are currently in Year 9, 10 or 11. VET provides you with an opportunity to participate in training that is focussed on industry specific skills and attributes that are required for a particular career. It is an excellent opportunity to explore possible careers and broaden your experiences outside the classroom environment.

**All VET programs are accredited towards the New SACE and you will also gain a nationally recognised qualification which links to further training or higher education.**

### Certificate II in Automotive

#### Pathway

Successful completion of this course will provide students with the practical skills and knowledge that will support further studies and future employment opportunities within the automotive industry. Students who advance to Certificate III in Automotive (AURO5) will select units from the specific "Field of Work" and specialise within this area. This qualification provides an introduction to the automotive industry, its culture, essential occupational health and safety requirements, the industrial and work organisation structure, communication skills, work planning, and basic use of tools and equipment. The qualification is built around a variety of practical activities that integrate the skills and embeds the facets of employability skills in context.

## Fashion

### Introduction to Applied Fashion Design and Technology (Units from Certificate II in Applied Fashion Design and Technology)

#### Semester 1

This course includes units from the Applied Fashion Design & Technology (LMT06) training package, and will cover the skills and knowledge to:

- Identify the elements and principles for the fashion design process including colour on the design process
- Draw and interpret a two-dimensional sketch of a garment, to identify construction features used by designers and patternmakers.

#### Format

1 day per week for 9 weeks. Offered 16/3/2012—1/6/2012 on a Friday.

#### Fee

\$695.52 per student (plus \$5.50 for student ID card). Plus \$55 for a Design Kit.

Students in Years 11 and 12

### Introduction to Applied Fashion Design and Technology (Units from Certificate II in Applied Fashion Design and Technology)

#### Afternoon/Evening Class –Semester One

This unit applies to identifying a wide range of fibres and fabrics commonly used in the construction of garments and accessories.

Fibre and fabric identification is integral to any design role in the fashion industry.

#### Format

3 hours per week over 10 week (4-7pm). Offered 25/4/2012—27/6/2012.

#### Fee

\$366.40 per student (plus \$5.50 for student ID card). Plus \$55 for a Design Kit. Fees subject to change for 2012

## Fashion

### Introduction to Applied Fashion Design and Technology (Units from Certificate II in Applied Fashion Design and Technology)

#### Semester 2

This course includes units from the Applied Fashion Design & Technology (LMT06) training package, and will cover the skills and knowledge to:

- Design and produce a simple garment. Planning and production of a simple garment involves medication of patterns, use of semi-industrial machines and producing storyboards.
- Follow defined OH&S policies and procedures relating to work being undertaken.

#### Format

1 day per week for 9 weeks—Friday 27/7/2012—Friday 21/9/2012.

#### Fee

\$772.80 per student (plus \$.50 for student ID card). Plus \$55 for a Design Kit.

#### Selection Criteria

Students in Years 11 and 12



## Fashion

### Introduction to Applied Fashion Design and Technology (Units from Certificate II in Applied Fashion Design and Technology)

#### Afternoon/Evening Classes—Semester Two

The unit covers the skills and technology to operate computers in the TCF industry. It covers basic Microsoft office skills as well as introducing learners to computer aided design applications using design software such as Corel Draw and Adobe Illustrator.

#### Format

3 hours per week over 10 weeks (4-7pm). Offered 18/7/2012—19/9/2012

#### Fee

\$386.40 per student (plus \$5.50 for student ID card). Plus \$55 for a Design Kit. Fees subject to change for 2012.

### Introduction to Applied Fashion Industry Product Knowledge

This program is offered during the April school holidays over 4 days and focuses on garment terminology, styling and customer service. The course will include:

- \* wardrobe planning
- \* fabrics
- \* garment terminology
- \* figure analysis
- \* fashion colours
- \* selling effectively

A great introduction for those seeking employment in fashion retail industry!!

Successful completion of this course, together with Fashion Industry Merchandising and Fashion Industry Operations, will result in eligibility for the Certificate II in Retail Operations.

#### Format

4 day intensive course during the school holidays. 9.00am-3.30pm each day. Offered Monday 16th April, 2012—Thursday 19th April 2012.

#### Fee

\$290.00 per student plus \$40.00 for workbooks and \$5.50 for a student ID card.

### Introduction to Fashion Industry Merchandising (Units from Certificate II in Retail) (SIR020207)

This program is offered during the school holidays over 4 days and includes visual merchandising and display designs in the fashion practice shop. The course will include display principles and elements, window styles, creating displays, merchandise layouts and lots more specifically related to the fashion industry.

#### Format

4 days intensive course during the July school holidays, 9.00am—3.30pm each day. Offered Monday 9th July 2012—Thursday 12th July 2012.

#### Fee

\$290.00 per student (plus \$5.50 for a student ID card). Plus \$40 for workbooks. Fees subject to change for 2012.

### Introduction to Fashion Industry Operations (Units from the Certificate II in Retail) (SIR020207)

This program is offered during the school holidays over 4 days and encompasses hot work effectively in a retail environment, using point of sale equipment and communicating in the workplace. Training is delivered in a hands on environment in the Fashion Practice Shop.

#### Format

3 day intensive course during the October school holidays. 9am—3.30pm each day.  
Offered Tuesday 2nd October 2012—Thursday 5th October 2012.

#### Fee

## Certificate I in Animal Studies

### What's it all about?

This accredited course is a Level 1 certificate from the Animal Care and Management Training Package (ACM10). It is intended for initial entry into the animal industry and is designed to provide students with general animal care information whilst also providing pathways to further training.

The Certificate I in Animal Studies involves both theory and practical activities.

### Who can do it?

Minimum entry requirement is successful completion of Year 10.

No prior experience with animals is required. Handling of animals is included; therefore TAFESA must be informed of phobias and/or allergies.

## Certificate II in Animal Studies

### What's it all about?

Glenunga VET courses start date - Thu Week 3

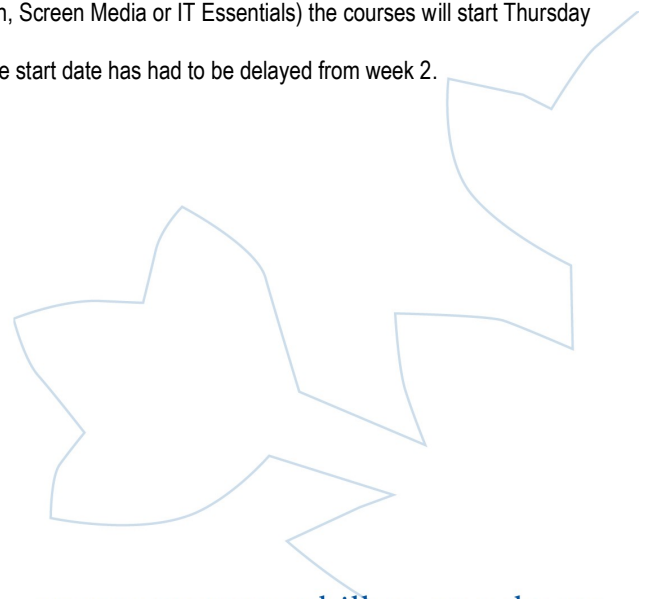

Trade outcomes are predominantly achieved through an Australian Apprenticeship and this Certificate II allows for inclusion of skills suited for entry to off-site occupations, such as joinery and shopfitting as well as carpentry, bricklaying and other occupations in general construction.

This Certificate II is designed to introduce learners to the recognised trade callings in the construction industry and provide meaningful credit in a construction industry Australian Apprenticeship.
