Why a Girls' School?

The following benefits have been identified by the International Coalition of Girls' Schools:

- 1. Students do **BETTER** academically, socially and emotionally.

- 6. Girls' schools better prepare students for **CAREER** and **LIFE SUCCESS**.
- 7. Students in girls' schools are **HAPPIER** and they **BELONG**.
- 8. Students from girls' schools have higher **ASPIRATIONS** and **AMBITIONS**.
- 9. There is **HIGHER PARTICIPATION** in sport and physical activity.
- 10. At girls' schools student **WELLBEING** comes **FIRST**.

Teaching girls using an approach which recognises these gender differences, enables girls to live up to their full potential and be comfortable being themselves.

Our History

Mary MacKillop lived and worked at Kensington for many years and she opened the first school here in 1872. The College began in the shadow of World War II in 1944 when secondary students, who had previously been taught at various Parish schools run by the Sisters of St Joseph, were brought together in Queen Street, Norwood.

In the first year, 100 students were enrolled in classes from First Year to Leaving Honours. The school was then known as St Joseph's Higher Primary.

In 1950, the school moved to Bridge Street, where a small building had served as the Parish school. During the 1950s, a hall was hired in High Street to cater for rapidly increasing student numbers. This led to a building project undertaken by the Sisters of St Joseph and, in 1963, the school, which had been renamed St Joseph's High School, moved into the Phillips Street site with an enrolment of 200 girls.

During the 1960s, student numbers increased, lay people joined the teaching staff and Sister Oliver remained

as Principal, making a unique and inestimable contribution to the growth and spirit of the school. In 1970, Sister Oliver's last year as Principal, the name was changed to Mary MacKillop College.

Since its humble beginnings, the College has continued to embrace students and educate them in the true spirit of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop. A very real and precious connection has been maintained with the Sisters and our girls enjoy classes in a modern, well-resourced, comfortable environment, while having access to the Chapel and Convent grounds where Mary herself lived and worked to promote educational opportunities for girls.

Our Faith

Our Teaching and Learning

As part of our College's Strategic Plan, we have developed a curriculum that is current, evidence-based and relevant to student needs as well as responsive to changes and developments in society.

Our broad curriculum and our high expectations of students encourages them to become self-directed and lifelong learners. The teaching and learning program aims to improve the student's ability to learn and to give them an opportunity to demonstrate what they know, understand and can do in a range of contexts. Our programs are designed to develop student confidence, knowledge, skills and capabilities relevant for an increasingly globalised and electronic society.

Teachers at Mary MacKillop College are provided contemporary professional and personal development opportunities to deepen and broaden their classroom practices and subject expertise.

This enables engaging and differentiated learning activities that support all students, including those with special interests, talents or capabilities.

We are committed to promoting the inclusion of students with disabilities and learning difficulties in mainstream education settings. Specialised education curriculum programs are provided for students with diagnosed intellectual disabilities and learning needs. Our inclusive ethos means all students with special needs are educated within the mainstream class and are provided with additional support and accommodations within the classroom and, when necessary, in the Learning Centre. All teaching and non-teaching staff are advocates for equality and inclusion for those students who experience difficulties in the educational and social sphere.

Mary MacKillop College provides excellence in a contemporary curriculum that equips our girls with the necessary skills to meet the challenges of their future.

Our Pastoral Care

At Mary MacKillop College, our touchstone, in pastorally caring for our students, is the charism and ethos of Mary MacKillop, who strived to consistently present the face of Christ to all.

Through the Pastoral Care Program, students learn how to care for themselves and others, how to exercise personal responsibility and empower themselves to take control of their own learning; planning for a productive future.

Pastoral Care teachers are integral to the life of the College community and care for the wellbeing of students in their Pastoral Care class. This is done by respecting each student as an individual, by encouraging them and showing interest in their progress and the achievement of their potential. Nurturing wellbeing includes spiritual and emotional wellbeing, as well as academic success.

As teachers, for student wellbeing we:

- Foster concern for each other, and an understanding of justice and the importance of relationships.
- Foster leadership and faith formation opportunities.
- Are accessible to students and approachable.
- Identify problems and seek support from providers in the school community.
- Respond to student concerns.
- Familiarise students with school policies and processes to empower

them to make effective, responsible choices and to better understand the meaning of being part of a community.

The College Counsellor also works closely with the students and will access outside support agencies when required.

Our Facilities

We foster your daughter's academic, spiritual, social, emotional and physical development in a safe, caring and contemporary learning environment.

Mary MacKillop College has a proud history of educational excellence for girls. Forward-thinking teachers and learning experiences that inspire have kept us at the forefront of girls' education for 70 years. Modern, well-equipped facilities underpin our fine educational offerings, with buildings around planted courtyards creating a strong sense of community.

TENISON CENTRE (completed Dec 2023) Our first building works in over 20 years, the Tenison Centre is MacKillop's brand new Science and Art innovation hub. The various bright, contemporary and flexible learning spaces encourage creativity and collaboration, and provide our girls with the skills and dispositions needed to meet the growing demand for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM) career pathways.

Other specialist facilities also activate the success of our students, with the Design and Technology Hub, Performing Arts Auditorium, Music Centre, Food and Fabric Technology Centres. all supporting engaged learning opportunities. Pastoral Care classrooms have been designed to create a sense of 'home', with colour, warmth and displays, enhancing the College spirit of being "A MacKillop Girl". Our multipurpose gymnasium, sports courts and playing field are well utilised for diverse curricula and extra-curricular physical education and community activities.


